# Introduction

Welcome to the North West Learning Partnership Initial Teacher Training offer for the academic year 2025-26.

The North West Learning Partnership (NWLP) has played a leading role in the training and professional development of trainee teachers, teachers, support staff, headteachers and leaders at all levels as well as contributing to the raising of standards through school-to-school support for over 10 years.

The **NWLP Initial Teacher Training** programmes are one year school-led pathways to PGCE for graduates, delivered and facilitated by serving Head Teachers, Senior Leaders, Lead Practitioners/ PDLs and other specialists in their field. NWLP is a **Lead Partner for Initial Teacher Education** with **Liverpool John Moores University** and we pride ourselves on the academic rigour of our training routes.

#### About the accredited provider

Our accredited body, Liverpool John Moores University has a wellestablished reputation in Initial Teacher Education which are monitored by Ofsted - the Office for Standards in Education.



In their most recent inspection (June 2023), Ofsted inspectors graded

both Primary and Secondary Initial Teacher Education provision at LJMU as 'Good'. This was a rigorous 4-day inspection covering the undergraduate, postgraduate and school-led programmes. Ofsted noted that a particular strength of the provision is the ambitious ITE curriculum, which is underpinned by appropriate and pertinent research and gives student teachers the breadth and depth of knowledge that they need to join the professional successfully.

We are proud that Ofsted also recognised that LJMU and its partner schools are **dedicated to training socially engaged teachers** who are well-prepared to make a positive difference to the life chances of pupils across Merseyside and beyond.

Our Partnership with LJMU ensures that our teachers develop a **deep and research-informed** understanding of subjects, the curriculum, learners and of learning. The PGCE from LJMU is co-designed to ensure that teaching and assignments are embedded in classroom practice.




# NWLP ITT - What is a 'school-led' route?

The **NWLP ITT school-led programmes** differ primarily from university-based PGCE routes in that our Trainee Teachers are **placed in school from Day 1** of the programme, called their 'Home Placement'. By being in school from the start of the school year, Trainees get to

experience the wider-life of their school and **build** relationships early with the staff and pupils.

The second key difference is that NWLP ITT courses are **planned and delivered** by Headteachers, Senior Leaders, and Specialists who are working with the **schools in our Partnership**. This means that our training can be tailored **to meet the needs** of the Trainee Teachers in our placement schools.

Both of these features mean our programme is **bespoke** and adapts year on year, depending on the make-up and the needs of our current Cohort of Trainee Teachers. In addition, as our programme is led by active members of the education world, adaptations are made in response to the experience of professionals and leaders to ensure Trainee Teachers receive innovative input, leading to the **best outcomes for all.**

# **NWLP ITT Partnership & Placement Schools**

**NWLP** works with schools across St Helens, Wigan, Halton, Merseyside and Knowsley. As such, we are able to place trainees in **schools close to their homes**, supporting our aim to promote a **good work/life balance**, enabling **more time for teaching and training**, less time for travelling.



In 2023/24, trainees were placed an average of 6.9 miles away from their home address to their main placement school. This is closer still in **2024/25**, with an **average of 3.7 miles**.

# NWLP ITT Partnership & Placement Schools




#### Placements are completed as below:

- Autumn term (September to December) spent in home placement and home class (classes for Secondary programmes)
- Spring half-term 1 (January to February half-term) spent in an away placement
- Spring half-term 2 and Summer Term (March to end of the course) spent back at home placement

Away placements are allocated to ensure trainees experience the contrasting Key Stage (Primary programmes) and a contrasting school setting (Primary and Secondary). These are discussed and allocated late in the Autumn term to determine which placement will best enrich each trainees' individual development as a teacher.

#### Support while on placement

We know that trainees spend the majority of their training year in their placement schools.



We select and work closely with our schools to ensure they are well-prepared for supporting the next generation of teachers, including **high-quality Mentor training** with LJMU and NWLP ITT and through regular Liaison Tutor visits.

All trainees are supported by school-based **Mentors**, a **Liaison Tutor** and the **NWLP** and **LIMU ITT** teams.

# **NWLP ITT Programmes**

All of the **NWLP ITT** one year school-led pathways **lead to Qualified Teacher Status** (QTS) and a **Post-Graduate Certificate in Education** (PGCE).

LJMU and NWLP's Initial Teacher Training programmes are designed to develop reflective practitioners who are able to apply a deep understanding of the curriculum, learners and learning to impact on the development and achievement of young people.

#### **Programme Length**

All programmes begin at the start of **September** and run through to the end of **June**. They are all **full-time** courses, meaning Monday to Friday each week is spent in either training or on placement in school. NWLP ITT do not offer distance or part-time courses.

The programme builds up slowly over the year, beginning first with an observation phase, before beginning teaching in November at 1 hour to 2 hours per day. This increases to around 3 hours to 4 hours per day at the end of the course.

#### **Training Locations**

The taught elements of the courses are delivered by both NWLP ITT at our **dedicated training centre** and by LJMU onsite at the city centre campus. The NWLP ITT purpose-built training centre is located in St Helens town centre, close to public transport links and to both the M62 and the East Lancs A580, providing a central base for all of our trainees to come together for their Subject Knowledge and Professional Studies training.



#### **Training and Subject Knowledge**

Learning from **expert colleagues**, both in school and in your taught sessions, you will develop your **confidence** in:

- Behaviour management
- Pedagogy
- Curriculum
- Assessment
- Professional behaviours

The Subject Knowledge and Professional Development sessions are front-loaded on the course, ensuring that your time in the classroom increases as the year progresses.

For the Primary programmes, NWLP ITT provides the Subject Knowledge training for English, Maths and Science, whilst on the Secondary programmes, these sessions are delivered at LJMU. NWLP ITT delivers all Professional Studies sessions, such as 'Educational Disadvantage' and 'Equality in Education' across all programmes, both Primary and Secondary.

# **NWLP ITT Programmes - Primary**

Each of the **Primary** programmes has been **designed** to equip our Trainee Teachers with the knowledge, skills and experience needed to develop into **confident practitioners**, whether that be on our age 3-7 route, the age 5-11 route, or on either of our Specialist programmes.

All of our Primary phase courses access the same core programme of Subject Knowledge and Professional Studies sessions, with the Specialist programmes accessing additional sessions focusing on their particular phase or subject specialism. The Primary with PE specialism route is deliv-

ered at LJMU and there is an additional focus in placement and in assignments on PE and sport. We choose placements carefully and allocate PE specialists to schools where there is a **strong PE profile** to best support our Trainees.



The **Primary with Mathematics** specialism route is offered through our affiliation with North West Maths Hub 3, allowing both our Maths Subject Knowledge sessions and our specialist sessions to be at the forefront of Primary Maths research and development. Trainees on this specialist route are placed in schools to **train alongside a Mastery specialist**, with focused additional sessions looking at aspects of the Primary Maths curriculum in greater depth and what it means to be a subject leader in Maths.

# Train to Teach in your school with NWLP Salaried School Direct in 2025/26

### What is Salaried School Direct?

The Salaried School Direct programme is a one year 'in-school' teacher training course for graduates, which leads to a PGCE and QTS recommendation.

The Salaried School Direct route is a response to what schools have asked for: more influence and control over the way that teachers are trained. It is a way of ensuring that Early Career Teachers deliver great lessons in your school. Working in partnership with **Liverpool John Moores University**, North West Learning Partnership School Direct selects and trains teachers that schools will want to employ, with the programme shaped to suit schools and pupils across the North West.

## Why is Salaried School Direct a benefit to trainees?

- All NWLP training on the one-year programme is delivered by current Headteachers, Senior Leaders, Lead practitioners and other specialists in their field, working in close partnership with North West Three Maths Hub
- Training days with Liverpool John Moores University
- Excellent networking leading to high employment rates
- Placement schools close to you: shorter commute to support trainee wellbeing
- Personalised programme of support from school mentors, liaison tutors, the School Direct team and LJMU tutors

## Why is Salaried School Direct a benefit to schools?

- Greater ownership over the trainees, allowing you to 'grow your own' teachers and future leaders
- Up skill experienced staff in their roles as Professional and ITT Mentors through high quality training with NWLP and LJMU
- Build relationships across phases and schools with the North West Learning Partnership

Additionally, the **salaried** pathway allows schools to train and retain high-quality graduate staff members and support their career goals by employing them on the unqualified teacher scale for the 1-year duration of the course, enabling them to continue working while they gain QTS. The cost of the Salaried route PGCE with QTS is £5000 and is paid directly to LIMU by the school, though the trainee may be asked to contribute to this cost.






